

Dear Brother Priest,

Please see today's update below and be assured we will keep you informed as we continue through this challenging time.

Resumption of Public Masses starting Monday, May 25 (if local jurisdiction allows)

Public Masses may resume starting Monday, May 25 within the Archdiocese of Washington in local jurisdictions that have lifted restrictions. For remaining jurisdictions that still have stay at home restrictions in place on May 25, resuming public Masses will wait until the restrictions are lifted. During the initial phase of our reopening, the faithful will continue to be dispensed from their obligation to attend Mass on Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation. Therefore, it would be spiritually helpful to continue to live stream Masses for those who choose to remain at home, such as those particularly vulnerable due to age or pre-existing health conditions.

The guidelines for *Public Celebration of Mass and Holy Communion Outside of Mass* are to help you make a plan that is specific to your church and worship environment.

Planning for how many parishioners can attend a given service will depend on the current guidance from your local jurisdiction and the size of your worship space.

For the District of Columbia, there is no guidance at this time for when a Phase I reopening will occur and the capacity that will be allowed.

For the State of Maryland, if you are able to resume public Masses on Monday, May 25, the total number of people will be limited to the people being socially distanced within the space. Additionally, the total number of people cannot exceed 50% of the space's allowed capacity. Please note that households of people that live in the same home can sit together.
