# **COVID-19 Virus Testing and Antibodies Testing**

Maryland and the District of Columbia have both substantially increased their capacity to test for whether someone is actively infected with the coronavirus. Testing to determine if a person has produced antibodies against the virus is also available.

- In the District, pre-screening is required and persons with symptoms or with the highest risk have priority over others. Persons under the age of 65 or who do not have underlying conditions or are not critical infrastructure workers are deemed to be a non-priority. All testing is by appointment. More information and testing locations are available <u>here</u>.
- Maryland has <u>announced</u> that appointment-free testing is available without a doctor's order at community-based testing sites for persons who suspect they may have been exposed to the virus even if they do not exhibit symptoms. In addition, pharmacists are now authorized to directly order tests and administer them. More information and testing locations are available <u>here</u>.
- In addition to testing for an active infection, testing is available to detect the presence of COVID-19 antibodies to determine if a person has already had the virus and now shows signs of potential immunity. These may be obtained through an individual's health care provider. At least one private testing facility, <u>Quest Diagnostics</u>, also offers a COVID-19 immune response test, which people can order for themselves online.

## Reminder for Those Testing Positive for the Coronavirus

As we have seen a few staff and priests test positive for the coronavirus, it is important to remember if you have any clergy or staff test positive to contact the Moderator's Office for assistance with next steps of how to respond and how to inform anyone that has been in direct or indirect contact with a person testing positive.

## Use of MDLIVE – Access to Health Care Remotely

As previously communicated, MDLIVE, linked <u>here</u>, gives you secure access to health care from the convenience of your phone, computer or tablet. MDLIVE also provides behavioral health assistance through online counseling sessions. This is

available to the clergy and employees who have health insurance through the Archdiocese of Washington. You can go to the website and register for MDLIVE now. That way your account will be ready to go if you need to contact a doctor. This is an excellent resource if you have a non-emergency medical need and are concerned about going to your doctor's office, ER or urgent care center.
