Pastoral Resources from the Office of Catechesis

Best Practices for Parish Food Pantries

We know that many of our parish food pantries are experiencing an increased demand during this time. It is important that our parishes continue this vital charitable work. To ensure that best practices for social distancing are being implemented to reduce the risk of transmission of COVID-19, we have developed a checklist for processing drop off donations and distribution of goods.

Parishes must follow all local, state and federal guidelines for gatherings during COVID-19.

Drop Off of Donations

- Parish food banks must ensure that staff and volunteers are not displaying symptoms (fever, coughing, etc.)
- One suggestion is to have a volunteer hold a sign stating: "Food donations can ONLY be accepted if they are placed in the trunk for a volunteer to receive."
- PPE *must* be worn for the protection of all (face masks, gloves, etc.)
- People dropping off items *must* not leave their car, *must* keep their windows rolled up, and *must* have items in their trunk for the ease of the volunteers
- Social distancing *must* be practiced (6 feet between volunteers)

Distribution of Goods

Should follow similar standards of safety measures as drop off of donations, including:

- Parish food banks *must* ensure that staff and volunteers are not displaying symptoms (fever, coughing, etc.)
- PPE must be worn for the protection of all (face masks, gloves, etc.)

For parishes that have the ability to do a drive-up food distribution:

• People picking up food *must* not leave their car, *must* keep their windows rolled up, and *must* have items placed in their trunk for the ease of the volunteers

For parishes that have a walk-in pantry and cannot do a drive through food distribution:

• Social distancing *must* be practiced (6 feet between volunteers and clients), limited number of clients in the pantry at a time and face masks must be worn at all times.
