#### **Jurisdictional Restrictions**

Restrictions remain in place in the District of Columbia, Prince George's County, and Montgomery County for houses of worship, and public Masses continue to be suspended. We are working hard to get these jurisdictions to allow houses of worship to open to the level specified in Governor Hogan's Stage 1 level for reopening. I share with you here our recent communication sent to the leaders of these jurisdictions.
