## Update on Use of Instruments for Anointing with Chrism

Regarding the use of instruments for anointing with chrism in the Sacrament of Confirmation, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments has clarified: "The use by the minister of an instrument (gloves, cotton swab...), does not affect the validity of the Sacrament." As such, the previous instruction is amended to permit the use of instruments. In such cases, please ensure that a separate instrument is used for each candidate and that the instruments are disposed of in a reverent manner (i.e. burned and the ashes buried, or simply buried). ## **Proxies for Sacraments of Initiation**

As parishes are planning to celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation, this is a clarification on parents serving as proxies for sponsors or godparents. Current canonical and liturgical norms prohibit the parents of the baptized/confirmed from serving as sponsors or godparents in order to emphasize rebirth and growth in the spiritual order. Under common practice, parents are discouraged from even serving as proxies (i.e. standing in the place of a sponsor or godparent who cannot attend or witness to the sacramental celebration). However, there is no prohibition *per se* canonically or liturgically on parents serving as proxy sponsors/godparents. It is still encouraged that sponsors/godparents be present at the liturgical celebrations if possible. However, given the extraordinary circumstances surrounding the pandemic, pastors may provide parents the option of serving as proxies. In such cases, it is important to distinguish clearly between the role of the sponsor and the role of the proxy. You can contact Fr. Martino Choi at **choim@adw.org** if you have any questions.
