## Cardinal-designate Gregory Consistory Resources

This Saturday, November 28, Pope Francis will elevate Cardinal-designate Wilton Gregory and 12 other prelates from around the world to the College of Cardinals. While the COVID-19 pandemic has changed many aspects of this historic day, the event will be viewable via a livestream link and on cable television.

# **Priest Wellness Survey**

As you know, a few weeks ago, Cardinal-designate Gregory sent all of us a letter encouraging us during these times of COVID. In that letter, he also said that he had asked Msgr. Stephen Rossetti to conduct an anonymous survey of the psychological and spiritual wellness of the priests in the Archdiocese of Washington. This survey is voluntary. Msgr. Rossetti tells me that he has received over 100 of them back from you. Thank you to those who have returned them. If you have not returned it, and have been meaning to, this note is a gentle reminder that you can still send it back to Msgr. Rossetti. The more he receives, the better he will be able to provide meaningful results and assistance to all of us.

# New DC Restrictions on Mass Attendance

On Monday, November 23, Mayor Bowser issued a new executive order, effective Wednesday, November 25, which reduces the maximum number of persons attending an indoor service at a house of worship to <u>fifty (50) persons</u>or fifty percent (50%), whichever is lower. Indoor gatherings (other than for religious services) are now capped at 10 persons, and outdoor gatherings (other than religious services) are now capped at 25 persons.
