# **Protect Employees and Volunteers with Remote Deposit Services**

As the pandemic continues and we journey towards Christmas, I highly encourage pastors to make use of remote deposit services offered by their parish bank. These services enable the pastor to safeguard parish employees and volunteers who are vulnerable to theft and harm while carrying cash deposits to the bank.

Services may vary by bank and at Capital One, where most of our parishes bank, include remote deposit of checks via scanner and fully-insured express deposit of cash via US Postal Service.

#### Covid 19 Vaccines

Throughout the past few weeks, we have heard a lot of information about the testing and development of safe and effective COVID-19 vaccines. There have been continuous conversations within the Catholic community about the safety and morality of these vaccines, so we are glad to say that both the Moderna and Pfizer have developed vaccines using mRNA, and without the use of controversial fetal cell lines. Similarly, both vaccines have been tested in an ethical way that is in line with previous moral statements made by Pope Benedict XVI and the Pontifical Academy for Life. Receiving either vaccine would be morally permissible in the Catholic Church and would also be an important prolife decision that would help to defend the most vulnerable. Through our own personal actions and decisions, we can help to protect our neighbors from the coronavirus pandemic.

## **Updated Parish Phone Call Script**

Last Spring, the Secretariat of Pastoral Ministry and Social Concerns developed a Parish Phone Call Script, in English and Spanish, for parishes to adapt and use to reach out to parishioners who were isolated or who were unable to participate in your parish community. ### **Year-End Tax Letter and Documentation of Expenses**

Linked <u>here</u> is the 2020 Year End tax letter for priests in active ministry; and linked <u>here</u> is the 2020 Year-End tax letter for Retired Priests.

Note that all Expense Advance Documentation must be submitted by January 1, 2021 in order for the expense advance amount not to be added to your W-2. The Expense Advance Document form is linked **here**.

All active archdiocesan priests will have their W-2 and 1095-C forms available in CHRIS from their parish or agency by January 31, 2021. All retired priests will have their 1099-R mailed out by January 31, 2021.
