<a href="#">Calvert</a>	Pre-register for health department appointment <a href="#">here</a> .	<p>The State of Maryland has moved into Phase 1-C, and each local county is obliged to follow the State’s directive. <b>School staff, clergy, and essential support staff (as determined by each pastor) are now eligible to register.</b></p> <p>Our Catholic Schools Office (CSO) has been collaborating with local counties and our school leaders to facilitate the registration of archdiocesan childcare workers, teachers and other school staff, as well as parish priests and parish staff who assist with their schools. Please continue to monitor CSO’s communications for further updates.</p> <p>Note: while particular phases may technically open, actual local vaccine availability and appointments to receive the vaccine may be delayed. Generally, people will be allowed appointments by their county of residence or employment.</p>
