## World Mission Sunday - October 23, 2022

Every year, the global Church unites to celebrate World Mission Sunday. On October 23, the World Mission Sunday collection will take place in churches around the world.

Pope Francis' message for World Mission Sunday this year reflects on the theme: "You shall be my witnesses" (Acts 1:8). He reminds us that the Church is missionary in nature and that we are called at Baptism to share in this mission together.

There will be a second collection at each of the Masses during the weekend of World Mission Sunday. The donations collected will be used to support the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. The Society for the Propagation of the Faith is the Holy Father's chief outreach to more than 1,100 mission dioceses across the globe that depend on annual help and the prayers of all of us.

Together, through our prayers and financial support, we bring the Lord's mercy and concrete help to the most vulnerable communities in the Pope's missions. In a divided world, World Mission Sunday rejoices in our unity as missionaries by our Baptism, as it offers each one of us an opportunity to support the life-giving presence of the Church among the poor and marginalized. 
## October Mass Headcount – Repeated Important Information
