## General Election Day - Tomorrow, Tuesday, November 8

The Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Washington encourages all eligible Catholics in the District and in the Maryland counties of Calvert, Charles, Montgomery, Prince George's and St Mary's, to participate as Catholic citizens in the political life of our nation. Each election cycle offers us the opportunity to share our moral values and our vision for a loving and just society. When we cast our ballots, we also have the obligation to make informed voting decisions. Remember, the bishops neither support nor oppose candidates and do not intend to tell Catholics for whom or against whom to vote. The responsibility to make those choices rests with each individual in light of a properly-formed conscience.

Before voting, Catholics are called to consider a wide range of issues, weighing each according to its moral importance. Becoming familiar with candidates' positions on issues involving human life and dignity is essential to responsible, faithful citizenship. It is beneficial to research the ballot ahead of time and gather the facts for every proposal and race.
