The Office of Life Issues serves our parish communities through education, pastoral supports, and advocacy efforts. In a post-Roe world, our ministries are adapting to how to best serve the Maryland and D.C. communities. As our mission expands to promote the dignity of life from conception until natural death, and at every stage in between, please consider sharing the following resources and opportunities with your parishes:

Maryland March for Life: Please join us on Monday, February 27th, 2023 for the 44th annual MD March for Life. It is more crucial than ever that we come together to support Bringing Maryland Back to Life. Participants will gather at St. Mary's Parish in Annapolis at 5:00 p.m. and proceed to Lawyer's Mall. Pro-Life Grant Program: Parishes can apply for up to \$2,000 in funding for any programs or resources that support families in need. Past grantees have received support for nutrition programs, youth education, diaper banks, and life issues presentations. Applications will be

sent out to parishes in April 2023. Please contact the Office of Life Issues for more information.

Beginning and End of Life Resources: The <u>Affirming Life Guide</u> is a resource for pastors and parish ministers to help them provide support to parents who have received an adverse or difficult prenatal diagnosis. The <u>End of Life Guide</u> is intended for families who have experienced the loss of a loved one to help guide them through the grieving and funeral process. Both resources are bilingual and printed copies are available upon request.

Catholic Civil Dialogue Initiative: This program facilitates structured conversation on Catholic Social Teaching for youth and young adults. It can also be used for parish social ministry teams and adult faith formation. The Office of Life Issues will provide training and resources for adult facilitators, as well as program support.
