## Mass and Eucharistic Procession:

- Pastors are encouraged to implement <u>Synod Recommendation 4</u> (The Beauty of the Catholic Faith) through the celebration of Sunday Mass and Eucharistic Adoration, which is also a goal of the USCCB's Eucharistic Revival. The USCCB has created a <u>Leader's</u> <u>Playbook for the Parish Year of Revival</u>.
- For assistance with evangelization efforts to invite people back to Mass and parish life post-COVID (<u>Synod Recommendation 1</u>), please contact Fr. Lalo Jara in the Office of Evangelization and Pastoral Planning at <u>jara-arayae@adw.org</u>.
- Like last year, parishes are invited to celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, on Sunday on June 11, 2023, by planning a Eucharistic procession. The Archdiocese of Washington's Liturgical Norms and Policies provide guidance on celebrating Eucharistic Processions. The Knights of Columbus have created a <u>planning resource</u> on Eucharistic processions that might also be of help.

# Future Events and Resources.

- The National Eucharistic Congress will be July 17-21, 2024, in Indianapolis, IN. Parishes are welcome to plan pilgrimages to attend the Congress. Tickets are \$375 per person - not including travel, hotel, or food and beverages. Non-refundable tickets must be purchased first before the Eucharistic Congress staff will release hotel booking information. - Cardinal Gregory will be creating 10 short videos during the next year about the Eucharist, Eucharistic devotions, and the Mass in preparation of the National Eucharistic Congress. - The bishops of USCCB Region VI will be participating in the Eucharistic Procession at the <u>Fourth Annual African National Eucharistic Congress</u> on July 22, 2023 at 3:00 p.m. at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception. The faithful are invited to attend the Procession.
- The USCCB sponsored <u>Eucharistic Pilgrimage</u> will pass through The Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Washington in early July 2024 on the way to the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis. Plans are underway to have a Eucharistic Procession and Mass

at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception. More information will be forthcoming soon.
