

The *Share, Learn, and Celebrate* initiative of The Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Washington (ADW) is designed to acknowledge, educate, and embed multicultural awareness in our diverse communities. Through *Share, Learn, and Celebrate* we hope to heighten awareness, knowledge and understanding through the engagement of Archdiocesan parishes, ministries, and the faithful in relevant activities. Stakeholders will be encouraged to share the achievements, identity, beauty, richness, and importance of each of our cultural communities as part of celebratory and historically significant occasions. Asian American, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander Heritage Month - History

Every year, in the month of May we celebrate Asian American, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander (AANHPI) Heritage Month to honor the cultural and historical contributions made by the communities of that descent to the United States. New York was the first to have an official commemoration in 1977 with a 10-day Asian/Pacific American Heritage Week. The celebration was nationally recognized in 1979 and officially extended to a month-long celebration in 1992. In 2009, the celebration was renamed from Asian Pacific Heritage Month. Native Hawaiians were added to the celebration in 2021 to acknowledge their unique cultural heritage and contributions to the nation. As of February 2025, US National Archives lists the celebration as the Asian American, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander (AANHPI) Heritage Month. Join us for the Annual Asian and Pacific Island Catholics Marian Pilgrimage at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C., on the first Saturday of May. The Asian Pacific Catholic Network organizes it in collaboration with the USCCB Secretariat of Cultural Diversity in the Church and with the support of the ADW. The pilgrimage honors the Blessed Mother and celebrates AANHPI Heritage Month. Attendees include diverse communities and representatives from more than 20 AANHPI national and ethnic groups. Parish Level Recommendations

Share

Asian American, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander Catholics represent a rich tapestry of diversity while sharing a profound commitment to our universal faith. We warmly invite parishioners with AANHPI backgrounds to share their stories and experiences related to the Church. This presents an invaluable opportunity for us to deepen our understanding of one another, explore the ways in which Catholicism has influenced their lives, and recognize how their unique cultures have enriched our collective faith and family connections. Engaging in these meaningful dialogues can strengthen our parish community and cultivate enduring relationships among all members.

Learn

The social and cultural influence of AANHPI Heritage has significantly strengthened Catholicism. Host a seminar at your parish to discuss the history, diversity, and complexity of AANHPI cultures. For resources and dialogue recommendations contact the OCDO at culturaldiversity@adw.org.

Celebrate

Plan liturgies to celebrate the cultural expression of Asian American, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander in the Church and our country. Consider scheduling opening/closing Masses for AANHPI Heritage Month, or services specifically recognizing AANHPI communities and traditions. Engage your parish's intercultural committee or others to plan and participate. Share

The AANHPI community has been blessed with multiple saints, and many more are on the path to sainthood. Most Catholics outside of Asia are only familiar with the Middle Eastern saints who walked with Jesus. Some may know the names of the men listed first in the large groups of canonized saints, such as <u>St. Lorenzo Ruiz</u>, <u>St. Paulo Miki</u>, <u>St. Andrew Kim Taegon</u>, <u>St. Augustine Zhao Rong</u>, <u>St. Pedro Calungsod</u>, <u>St. Andrew Dung Lac</u> and the <u>117 Vietnamese Martyrs</u>. However, there are many other Asian saints and holy people, including numerous women, who are also known for their incredible actions, such as <u>St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta</u>, <u>St. Mary Zhu Wu</u>, and many more.

Learn

Those featured above are just a few examples of our history's many inspiring AANHPI Catholics. We invite you to delve deeper into the lives of other remarkable Catholics and the causes that champion their endeavors. Celebrate

Plan events with parishioners to discuss their favorite AANHPI saints. This can be an opportunity to talk about their lives, miracles, and their impact on the Catholic Church. This activity can include screening a movie featuring historical AANHPI Catholic luminaries. Host these events at your RCIA, religious education, or parent education programs. Your parish is home to a vibrant and diverse AANHPI community, with rich traditions worth celebrating. Consider hosting an AANHPI heritage festival that highlights art, music, and cuisine, and invite your AANHPI parishioners and neighbors to create exhibits highlighting their Catholic traditions to further showcase their cultural influence in the community. Take the opportunity to highlight prominent AANHPI leaders, innovators, and influencers from our nation.

Learn
